Assistantship: Molecular Insect-Plant Interactions

A Graduate Assistantship will be available in the Fall 2010 in the laboratory of Dr. Nick Miller, Department of Entomology, at the University of Nebraska-Lincoln. Students seeking to pursue either a PhD or MS are welcome to apply. The student will conduct a research project in the area of molecular interactions between insects and plants. In addition, the student will assist with non-thesis projects in the laboratory for up to 20 hours per week. There will be significant opportunities to gain experience working with high-throughput "next-generation" sequencing systems and the data that they produce, especially in studies of gene expression.

The Graduate Assistantship provides a monthly stipend, tuition support, and partial funding of health insurance.
