

Graduate Assistantship in Entomology

A Graduate Research Assistantship (0.49 FTE) is available for a qualified M. S. or Ph. D. student in the Department of Entomology at the University of Nebraska-Lincoln. Graduate assistants are expected to be involved in up to 20 hours per week with non-thesis related projects supervised by their major advisors.

Thesis research will be focused on the response of corn rootworms to volunteer corn in soybeans. This research is part of a multi-disciplinary project evaluating the impact of volunteer corn in soybeans as a weed, and as an reservoir for corn rootworms and foliar diseases of corn.

The current assistantship stipends [\$1,587.50/month (M. S.), \$1667.50/month (Ph. D)] include a waiver of out-of-state tuition, tuition remission for up to 12 credit hours per semester, and partial funding of health insurance.
