Common Name: Small Milkweed bug

Scientific Name: Lygaeus kalmii

Type of feeder (Chewing, sucking, etc.): Piercing/sucking mouthparts for feeding on plant or animal juices.

Host plant/s: The small milkweed bugs' primary host is milkweed on which they lay their eggs. Considered more of a generalist feeder as they feed on other plants and will scavenge on dead insects.

Description of Damage (larvae and adults): Primary damage may be of aesthetics, as these bugs can appear in large numbers around structures that have suitable feeding sites. Ornamental plants including some milkweed, oleander and other flowering plants will be fed upon and may show signs of feeding damage.
