Common Name: Curled rose sawfly

Scientific Name: *Allantus cinctus*

Order and Family: Hymenoptera: Tenthredinidae

Size and Appearance:

Larva/Nymph	13 – 21 mm	Pale green dorsally, white ventrally, covered with small white tubercles. Orange-yellow head with small black eyespots.
Adult	6.0 – 9.0 mm	Body is shiny black with yellow band across abdomen, two yellow dots on thorax, and small triangle pointing toward the head.
Pupa (if applicable)		

Type of feeder (Chewing, sucking, etc.): Chewing

Host/s: Rose, *Fragaria*

Description of Damage (predator, parasitoid, pollinator, etc.): Larval feeding causes leaf curl and skeletonization. The larvae also bore into twigs to pupate, causing most of the damage.
