Common Name: Curled rose sawfly

Larva/Nymph	13 – 21 mm	Pale green dorsally, white ventrally, covered with small white tubercles. Orange-yellow head with small black eyespots.
Adult	6.0 – 9.0 mm	Body is shiny black with yellow band across abdomen, two yellow dots on thorax, and small triangle pointing toward the head.

Type of feeder (Chewing, sucking, etc.): Chewing

Host/s: Rose, Fragaria

**Description of Damage (predator, parasitoid, pollinator, etc.):** Larval feeding causes leaf curl and skeletonization. The larvae also bore into twigs to pupate, causing most of the damage.
