**Host plant:** Adults and nymphs feed on fruit and seeds of various plants including beans, corn, peaches, and wheat.

**Description of Damage:** Economic Injury is minor to rare, due to feeding pattern. Damage will appear to be shriveled grain or cat-facing on fruits.
