Scientific Name: Callirhytis quercuspunctata

Type of feeder: Galls formed by larval infestation. Larvae feed within gall.

Host plants: Oak trees (Quercus spp.) are all prone to infection from Gouty oak gall wasp.

**Description of Damage:** Galls are not aesthetically pleasing, but only very severe infestations may cause any damage through nutrient loss.
