
Book Discussion: A Macabre Myth of a Moth-Man

The book I will be outlining discussion questions for here is *A Macabre Myth of a Moth-Man*, the debut novel of author Brad Fear, published by AuthorHouse. I provide here a brief spoiler-free summary of the book.



Summary:

We are introduced at the beginning to Moth, a part human, part moth private investigator who has been garnering some fame in Britain recently as "The Moth-Man." Moth, along with his lizard-like compatriot Ozzy, is on a quest for revenge against the team of scientists who turned him into what he is now. He meets many strange and unsavory characters along the way, including a silver-eyed old man, with a strange connection to ravens, and a murderous robot.

Nina is a barmaid helping a friend with a documentary about the legend of the mysterious Moth-

Man to take her mind off her ex-boyfriend. In her investigation, however, she soon learns an uncomfortable truth.

Discussion Questions:

- 1. Nina says several times throughout the book that "she's not a zoologist, she just studied zoology." Is there a difference? What is the distinction, if any, between a scientist and someone who has studied a science?
- 2. What parts of Moth's anatomy are accurate to real-life moths or insects? Which parts are less accurate?
- 3. Moth complains throughout the book of being unable to sleep. Is this a character element or is this a parallel to real-world moths?
- 4. If a real moth were to grow to the size of a human, would they still be able to do things like cling to walls and fly?
- 5. Why do you think that human-animal hybrids capture people's imagination, like Moth-Man, or more famous examples like Spider-Man and Batman?
- 6. How are moths, or insects more generally, portrayed in this book? Are they portrayed positively or negatively?
